Annual Parish Meeting Minutes of 2023 February 5, 2023 at 12:13 pm

Opening

o The motion to approve 2022 minutes was called by Doug Hayes and 2nd by Tom Redwine.

Reports

- Senior Warden Stephen Walker spoke of his appreciation of the congregation, being patient with the numerous rectors this year and the stability with Father George.
- O Junior Warden Debra Gardner spoke of the numerous projects completed last year Memorial Garden, Front entrance, new crosses, Streetlights, Kitchen, Rented storage buildings, new doors, turf, and overall cleaning of the church. She announced the clothing pantry is permanently closed and that space will now be used by the Boy Scouts. Thanks to volunteers for helping, with special thanks to Darla Carpenter and Deborah Webb for their work with the Food Pantry and Manna Meals.
- Treasurer Alvin Bailey discussed expenses. The spending was down in 2022, but the finances are still relying on investments and trusts rather than annual giving. Investments are down due to the stock market. Special thanks to David Munson for the financial gift of \$50,000 to be used on projects.
- Altar Guild Mary Hooker thanked all those who helped, and reported the Guild has two new members. All parishioners are welcome to join the Altar Guild.
- Junior Warden Debra Gardner spoke on behalf of the Parish Day School. A new three-year-old class has opened. The school is full. Interim Kiry Davis is doing a good job, recently replacing Whitney Farris as Head of Day School.
- o Interim Rector, Father George Joseph spoke on how much he is enjoying his time at St. Luke's and his appreciation for the support he has been given.

Sr. Warden's Report February 4, 2024

The life of a parish is led daily under the direction of the Parish Priest. The Priest, of course, performs their regular duties on Sundays with our church services and leads us on our spiritual journey and is also responsible for many other aspects of daily church life. But during this past year it has fallen upon your Vestry to fill the vacancies left by the absence of a full-time Rector. I believe our church has not only continued on its path of spreading the Word of God and the gospel but have added much more daily interactions with our community and our congregation. Examples of this can be seen in the added ministry of streaming Morning Prayer on social media. Another example is the work taken on by our LEM's to ensure the sick and homebound can continue to receive communion whether they are members of our church or not. To date, we have 15 recipients on our list who receive communion in their homes. This has led to wonderful relationships to some who have no connection to St. Luke's at all!

We have also coordinated with the Parish Day School to perform the Blessing of the Animals and Blessing of the Backpacks. We have continued to host numerous activities for community groups including Mono Drama that meets here quarterly, the Boy Scout Troop 403 that meets here weekly and the Scout Pack that meets here monthly. We provide meeting space for the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Master Gardeners, a meeting of the leaders of Downtown Denison, a dance school and of course our weekly meeting of the Denison Rotary Club. We have also celebrated three birthday parties and hosted a complete Thanksgiving luncheon for the Parish Day School and all of the parents.

This past year has also seen the formation of our children's Sunday school class complete with a regular curriculum. We had a most wonderful time at our 150th anniversary with a joyful celebration, which brought some familiar faces to our gathering such as Fr. Neal Michell and Fr. David Petrash. Altogether we had over one hundred people attend the celebration as it was live streamed on social media. Mr. Tom Redwine and I were the representatives of St. Luke's to receive our proclamation from the Mayor of Denison recognizing our achievement of 150 years of service to this community. All of this was coordinated through our office and overseen by your Vestry.

In addition to these achievements, some of our active congregants have formed a Craft Circle and a Quilting Group. Our sanctuary has witnessed one wedding, 8 confirmations, a baptism and a funeral this past year. We have also sent two new delegates to the Convention this past year and they relayed to me the joy they had in

attending such an important event and representing all of us with their voice and vote. We have also said our goodbyes to Fr. George Joseph as his time with us has come to an end. I sincerely thank him for all he has done for us and I, as well as all of us, wish him the best and bid him Godspeed.

I would like to thank you all for continuing to support your church through your generous tithes and donations. Our ministries such as the food pantry and Manna Meal would not be possible without your financial support and the help of our volunteers. May this new year bring new hope, new joy, and new life to our beloved St. Luke's.

Jr. Wardens Report February 4, 2024

It has been my pleasure to serve for a third year as your Junior Warden. As with the last two years, there was a long list of maintenance and upgrades needed. With the help of many volunteers and generous donations we were able to maintain and update our church and grounds. Every time we requested help to complete a job, parishioners provided the funds and/or time. Without their help we would not have been able to make this list of improvements in 2023:

- Memorial Garden restoration and seasonal refresh
- Roof replaced over Kohfeldt Hall and Parish offices replaced, and overhang repaired.
- Screens replaced on the windows along Woodard St.
- Restored the sound baffles on the walls of Kohfeldt Hall
- Replaced all locks/keys in the Church and School and added a keypad and fob reader.
- Solar Screens installed on the windows in the Parish hallway.
- Grab bars were added to the Altar Closet for safety.
- Duplex clean up and repairs to the outside siding Sliding Door replaced.
- Repaired the siding and removed a dead tree at 409 Gandy.
- Updated the landscaping along Fannin St.
- Replaced the office camera, added an Internet Mesh and Updated the Parish website.
- The sidewalk in front of the Parish office was repaired.
- Painted the Rector's office, the Church office and the Sunday School room.
- Two donated Magnolia trees were donated and planted on Fannin St.

Our first Parish Workday was organized. A small group of parishioners showed up, but got a lot accomplished on the church and school grounds and enjoyed a lunch provided by Stephen.

Additionally, I want to provide an update on the church Food Ministries. The Food Pantry is managed by Darla Carpenter and provided meals for 2,332 individuals (double the number served last year) with the help of food donations from the Boy Scouts, the City of Denison and St. Patrick's Catholic Church. Manna Meals and St. Luke's kitchen is run by Deborah Webb. She, along with many volunteers, provided weekly hot meals for a total of 1,682 clients.

Thank you to everyone who helped maintain our beautiful and historic church in 2023.





Our year began under the leadership of Father George Joseph, our Priest-in-Charge. The Altar Guild, know as St. Monica's guild, had three loyal teams. We were kept 'on our toes' by dutifully assisting where needed.

Our responsibilities were setting up two Holy Eucharist services every Sunday. That included setting the Lord's table with a vested Chalice, as well as setting our Credence Table with Wine, Bread, and Water. We put fresh flowers on the Retable each Sunday except during Lent and Advent. We made sure the 'colors' were changed as required. We were responsible for laundering the small linens, and occasionally taking the larger items to the cleaner. Our other duties included changing numbers on the Hymn Boards, filling the Altar candles with oil, changing out the used Prayer candles, etc. Before Palm Sunday, we made Palm Crosses for the congregation, and we decorated the church at Easter with Easter Lillies and at Christmas with Poinsettias.

I thank each and every one of the dedicated ladies who gave their special time to our Lord's work.

St. Luke's Parish Day School: Where Faith and Education Meet.

Dear St. Luke's Church Family,

St. Luke's School thanks you for your continuous prayers and support as we continue to pour into the lives of the youth in our community! This letter is to provide an update on the happenings of our 2023-2024 school year.

I assumed the position of Interim Director in January 2023, taking on the role of School Director in April 2023. Currently, the school is adequately staffed, and all our full-time teachers have either obtained or are actively pursuing their Child Development Associate credential. Additionally, a few are progressing towards earning their associate degree. Our collaboration with Texoma Workforce remains excellent, facilitating ongoing education and ensuring the delivery of high-quality care.

Projects we have completed this past year include a bathroom remodel for our two main restrooms, a half wall built to better secure our playroom, additional camera security coverage, and updating our internet mesh system. The latter two projects came on after an electrical storm in August 2023. This also resulted in a new HVAC system installed as well as a new color printer/copying machine.

Project areas of focus for this next year include lighting for outside of the school, potential additional HVAC system, and looking into plumbing upstairs. Our upstairs restrooms are currently out of order. Additionally, we are seeking a new laminator and dye cut parts.

Our biggest struggle this year has been enrollment in lieu of a tuition increase. We sadly saw a few long-term families leave our facility. While we have onboarded new families who have shown great joy, the increase did not have the effect we had hoped. We currently have 42 students with 3 prospective students. We have lowered tuition, which our families have been appreciative. In addition, this semester will be focused on family involvement, marketing strategies, and community outreach. With dedication and persistence, we are hopeful for new families to join our sweet school!

Our chapter of the Order of the Daughters of the King is not meeting regularly at this time. We provide refreshments after the 10:30AM service when there is a 5th Sunday in a month.

In addition, every few months, I ask members to email me a list of people who need our prayers. When I receive these, I combine them and email them to our members. There is a blue box at the back of the church on the credenza with cards in it. People may fill out the card and put it in the offering plate or back in the blue box and we will add it to our list.

Our form which I send out has the following categories: (1) For health and healing; (2) for help in aging; (3) for direction in God's will; (4) for the repose of the soul/s of and comfort for the family/ies of (the deceased person's name); (5) for travel; (6) for peace and military safety; (7) for relationships; (8) for careers and job situations; (9) for faith in Christ/spiritual growth; (10) for special concerns (which can cover many situations); (11) thanksgiving for prayers answered.

If people need prayer in these categories, we will welcome your submissions on the cards.

DOK is an Order for women who are communicants of Episcopalian and Anglican churches as well as some Lutheran and Roman Catholic churches. It was first organized in 1885 in New York City and there are now chapters around the world with approximately 25,000 members. We undertake a Rule of Life pledging ourselves to prayer and service. A quarterly magazine, "The Royal Cross", is sent to members and there are also monthly online columns. Prior to joining DOK, there is a required study course, and upon completion, members receive the unique cross of the Order which is supposed to be worn at all times.
